Parent Committee on Companion Animals, Non-Domestic & Endangered Species (CANDES)

Report to the IETS Board of Governors June 2008

Our main activity in 2008 was to develop and confirm the program for the 2009 IETS post-conference workshop/symposium on the "Implementation of Artificial Insemination in CANDES" (Appendix 1). We have a total of 10 speakers who, besides their presentations, have been asked to produce an article of 10 pages or less for the proceedings. We will have a joint proceedings issue in *Theriogenology* with the proceedings from George Seidel's preconference symposium on an update of sperm sexing technology. Bids were received from both the Editors from *Theriogenology* and *Reproduction, Fertility and Development*, and it was clear that *Theriogenology* gave us the best option by way of cost per issue and timeframe for delivery. Following the workshop/symposium, the CANDES Research and Technology Subcommittee Chairs plan to prepare a summary article to be published in the IETS Newsletter as well as a more detailed manuscript to be published in a refereed journal.

Thanks to our Subcommittee Co-Chairs, but particularly to Dr. Damien Paris, we came up with a sponsorship package that has been widely distributed to a variety of industries, universities and research facilities (Appendix 2). Thus far we have one Patron Sponsor and two Gold Sponsors (total: USD 12,000) and plan to charge USD 100 for the registration fee per person that will include the proceedings issue and two coffee/tea breaks.

Since the January 2008 meeting, several new IETS members have asked to join the CANDES Committee and we hope to involve them in several ongoing projects such as: adding new protocols to the Research Subcommittee Resource Manual, the regulatory guideline templates for the Regulatory Subcommittee, additional resources for the Technology Subcommittee and assistance in the development of the "Biomaterial Versus Live Animal Transport Disease Risk Analysis" by the Regulatory and Health and Safety Subcommittees.
